Agent	% of all agents ingested
Drugs	26.5
Analgesics	7.1
Cold/cough preparations	5.1
Vitamins	3.6
Gastrointestinal preparations	3.0
Antimicrobials	2.8
Antihistamines	2.6
Hormones/hormone antagonists	2.3
Cosmetics and personal care products	13.2
Cleaning substances	10.5
Foreign bodies	7.1
Topical agents	6.6
Plants	6.3
Pesticides	4.0
Arts/crafts/office supplies	2.7
Hydrocarbons	0.9



Substances that may be Radiopaque

- Barium
- Enteric coated tablets
- Tricyclics
- Antidepressants, Antihistamines
- Chloral hydrate, Calcium, Cocaine condoms
- Heavy metals
- Iodides, iron
- Potassium, phenothiazines, phenytoin, Pepto-Bismol



One Pill Can Kill

- Calcium Channel blockers
- Clonidine/Imidazolines
- **Salicylates**
- Narcotics (methadone)
- Sulfonylureas
- **Cyclic antidepressants**
- Lomotil
- Oil of Wintergreen
- Chloroquine
- Camphor



Huffing

- Ingestion of inhalants for euphoric effect
- >1000 deaths annually
- Death may occur with first exposure
- 1 in 5 8th graders have tried



Huffing- Signs of abuse

- Drowsiness
- Lightheadedness
- Loss of inhibition
- Hallucinations or delusions
- Belligerence
- Depression and mood changes
- Weight loss
- Lack of coordination
- Irritability
- Weakness

Falls in Children

- >2.3 million children 14 years or younger are treated in Emergency Departments annually for fall related injuries
- Over half are <5 years old
- Head injury primary cause of death
- Lacerations and fractures most common



Are playgrounds safe???

- Over 100,000 injuries/year
- 95% on home trampolines
- 71% extremity injuries
- Soft tissue most common, then fractures and dislocations
- Up to 11% head injuries

Lawnmower Injuries

- Approx 250,000 injuries annually
- >18,000 in children
- Injury types:
 - lacerations
 - soft tissue injuries
 - burns
 - fractures
- AAP recommendations
 - >16 y/o for riding mowers
 - >12 y/o for push mowers



Animal Instincts



Dog Bites

- 4.5 million reported dog bites/year
- 1 in 5 require medical attention
- Age 5-9 highest incidence





 - CT = BAD NEWS!!




I just woke up!

 - 1 fatal
 - 1 non-fatal
 - 1 serious
- Softball
 - 1 fatal
 - 1 serious
- Wrestling
 - 0 fatal/non-fatal
 - 1 serious



NCCSI Stats: 2008-2009

- Cheerleading
 - 1 non-fatal
 - 1 serious

Track

- 0 fatal
- 1 non-fatal
- 2 serious

- Tennis
 - 0 all categories

So what do we do???

- **Airway with C-Spine Control**
 - Open, maintain, clear, basic adjuncts
- **Breathing**
 - Present? rescue breath, chest rise/fall
- **Circulation with hemorrhage control**
 - Present? Cap refill, CPR,
- **Disability**
 - AVPU scale, MAE/SAE, level of disability, GCS
- **Exposure/Environment**
 - Look EVERYWHERE!!! / WARM
